

The Lewisburg Water and Sewer Board held its regular monthly meeting on October 28, 2025. The meeting was held at 100 Water Street, Lewisburg, Tennessee. Board members present were Board Chairman Bill Marsh, Secretary Joe Harris, and Board Member Linda Thomas. Also present were General Manager Trigg Cathey, Assistant Manager Robert Biggers, Staff Engineer Jake Marquardt, Supervisors Pete Griffin, Roscoe Brannon, Chris Haislip, Tommy Wallace, Russ Williams, Billing Clerk Lucy Demastus, and David Buschmann (Insight Properties)

Chairman Bill Marsh Called the meeting to order at 12:00PM.

- Item 1. The Motion was made by Joe Harris to approve the minutes of September 16, 2025, meeting. Linda Thomas seconded the motion. Motion passed.
Voice vote – 3 ayes.
- Item 2. September Bills and Financial Statement – General Manager Trigg Cathey reported on the September bills and financial statement. Linda Thomas made the motion to approve the September bills and financial statement. The motion was seconded by Joe Harris. Motion passed. Voice vote – 3 ayes.
- Item 3. Water – Sewer Request – There were 5 residential water taps request and 1 request for residential sewer in the month of September.
- Item 4. Water Plant – Reports and Memos – The water plant operated an average of 19.9 hours per day. The plant monthly capacity was 87.5%. The three-month water loss average was 27.8% for the month of September.

The Lewisburg water treatment plant treated 105.0 MG of water for the month with an average of 3.5 MG of water per day.

- Item 5. Wastewater Plant – Employees Processed 395,165 gallons of sludge into biosolids and hauled 23,400 gallons of mud from Cornersville WWTP to be converted into biosolids.

Employees hauled 345 tons of biosolids to various farms.

Flow Totals

Employees treated and discharged 65.8 MG of wastewater at the Lewisburg Plant.

Employees treated and discharged 2.8 MG of wastewater at the Cornersville Plant.

Five industries were sampled: Talos, Westrock, Centurion, Baron x2 and Allison x2

Item 6. Other Business

6a. Project Update

1. We have run a 500-foot sewer line at Jackson Trailer Park that bypasses the old line. The old line ran under the trailers, and it would be almost impossible to service. The old line and manhole will be crushed after we confirm that the new line is functioning. This job was done in one week by our workforce.
2. Out at the New Lake we valved off the water line that runs from the pump house to the lake. We then severed the line to ensure no one ever pulls and breaks the line and drains the lake.
3. We are replacing a two-inch galvanized line on West Commerce (across from Griffin Cook). This new line will be PVC and will connect two mains, therefore giving us redundant, secondary feed in the event of a leak.
4. We are beginning a project to replace 3,000 feet of the 2-inch galvanized water line on Belfast-Farmington Road. We will install the new line prior to retiring the existing line. Materials are being ordered, and this will be a long-term job done by in-house labor, over the next six months. This line has given us many breaks and issues in the past.

- 6b. Resolution – approval to accept the bid from H2O Innovation to begin Phase 2 (design) upon completed review of the final proposal from H2O Innovation by Wauford Engineering and Davis Law Firm – Bill Marsh made a motion to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Joe Harris. Motion carried unanimously.
