

The Lewisburg Water and Sewer Board held its regular monthly meeting on August 19, 2025. The meeting was being held at 100 Water Street, Lewisburg, Tennessee. Board members present were Board Charman Bill Marsh, Secretary Joe Harris, and Board Member Linda Thomas. Also present were General Manager Trigg Cathey, Assistant Manager Robert Biggers, Staff Engineer Jake Marquardt, Supervisors Pete Griffin, Terry Smith, Chris Haslip, Russ Williams, Tommy Wallace, Roscoe Brannon, Billing Clerk Lucy Demastus, Administrative Assistant Lisa Parsons, Retiree Caryl Giles, City Council member Tommy Burns, Donnie Groves and Phillip Dye (City of Chapel Hill), Ken Zumstein and David Bushmann (Insight Properties) were also in attendance.

Chairman Bill Marsh Called the meeting to order at 12:00PM.

- Item 1. The Motion was made by Joe Harris to approve the minutes of July 8, 2025, meeting. Linda Thomas seconded the motion. Motion passed. Voice vote – 3 ayes.
- Item 2. July Bills and Financial Statement – Administrative Assistant Lisa Parsons reported on the July bills and financial statement. Linda Thomas made the motion to approve the July bills and financial statement. The motion was seconded by Joe Harris. Motion passed. Voice vote – 3 ayes.
- Item 3. Water – Sewer Request – There were 3 residential water taps request and 0 request for residential sewer in the month of July.
- Item 4. Water Plant – Reports and Memos – The water plant operated an average of 20.4 hours per day. The plant monthly capacity was 88.2%. The three-month water loss average was 30.2% for the month of July.

The Lewisburg water treatment plant treated 109.4 MG of water for the month with an average of 3.5 MG of water per day.

- Item 5. Wastewater Plant – Employees Processed 348,527 gallons of sludge into biosolids and hauled 104,000 gallons of mud from Cornersville WWTP to be converted into biosolids.

Employees hauled 210 tons of biosolids to various farms.

Employees treated and discharged 40.5 MG of wastewater at the Lewisburg Plant.

Employees treated and discharged 2.7 MG of wastewater at the Cornersville Plant.

Item 6. Other Business

6a. Project Update

1. The new water main running along the east side of Cornersville Road, across the street from Fairview market, is completed and online.
2. We are replacing the sewer pipe and manholes under Mechanico Trail. We have replaced 4 manholes, (with 3 manholes due to a straightening of the line) and have installed approximately 50% of the sewer line. The asphalt has been cut on 75% of the project. This is an in-house project.

6b. Resolution – Joe Harris made a motion to approve the resolution to have Wauford Engineering run a study to investigate pumping the wastewater in Cornersville back to the Lewisburg facility. The motion was seconded by Linda Thomas. Motion passed unanimously.

The contract for this study is not to exceed \$49,000.00

6c. Bill Marsh made a motion to adjust our after-hours reconnect policy. The motion was seconded by Linda Thomas. Motion passed unanimously.
